- Initially developed by the Transatlantic Business Dialogue (TABD)
- To establish e-mobility as a key element of the Transatlantic Economic Council (TEC), a joint activity of the US and EU governments
- The plan proposes joint activities to address key barriers to widespread adoption of EVs ... *notably STANDARDS*
- Plan provides a framework for cooperation and support for common national objectives and the multinational automotive industry

- Standardization
 - Vehicle inlets, charging, communication, safety, etc. ... *and a schedule that is consistent with manufacturing plans and national objectives*
- Regulatory activities
 - Cooperation/coordination between regulators
- Batteries/energy storage
 - Transport, safety
- E-mobility research
 - IT infrastructure, etc.
- Smart grid communication methods
 - EV compatibility, metering, IT security, etc.
- Exchange of information between ongoing projects

- EU and US representatives of the TEC reviewing scope
- Targeting a joint agreement before the end of the year
